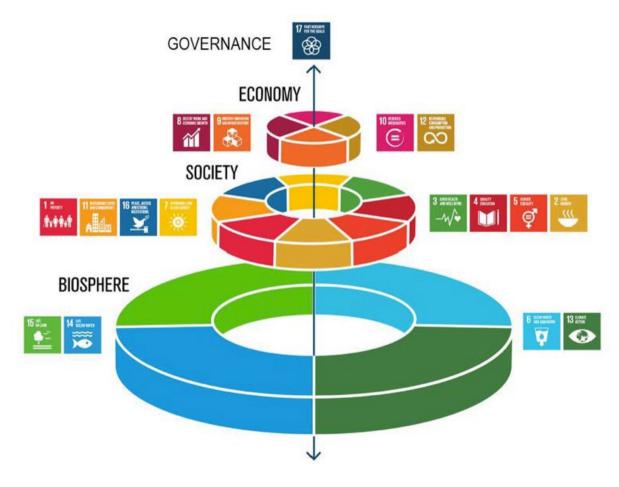

Aus den skandinavischen Ländern Initiative zu den Inner Development Goals (IDGs)

- Ausgangspunkt ist ein "blind spot" bei den Bemühungen um eine nachhaltigere Zukunft
- Wir wissen was bis 2030 getan werden müsste, doch bislang ist der Erfolg gering ("attitude-behavior-gap")
- Stattdessen müsse es stärker darum gehen, wie man Fähigkeiten, Qualitäten und Fertigkeiten bei jenen befördern könne, die den Wandel tragen sollen

When facing challenging tasks, there is a need for a range of cognitive and emotional skills and other qualities that go beyond what most people normally learn in schools and higher education. We believe that significant knowledge and insight has accumulated over the years about what these skills and qualities are and how they evolve, in several research fields, such as adult learning and development and in the study of strategic leadership regarding complex issues, such as sustainability studies.

The purpose of the Inner Development Goals project is to draw attention to the need to support development of abilities, skills and other inner qualities for people and organizations involved in efforts to contribute to a more sustainable global society. By having a framework that is easy to grasp and that describes those skills and qualities, we hope to mobilize a broader engagement and effort among organizations, companies and institutions to significantly increase the investments in efforts to develop crucial skills and qualities.

1. Being — Relationship to Self

Cultivating our inner life and developing and deepening our relationship to our thoughts, feelings and body help us be present, intentional and non-reactive when we face complexity.

Inner Compass

Having a deeply felt sense of responsibility and commitment to values and purposes relating to the good of the whole.

Integrity and Authenticity

A commitment and ability to act with sincerity, honesty and integrity.

Openness and Learning Mindset

Having a basic mindset of curiosity and a willingness to be vulnerable and embrace change and grow.

Self-awareness

2. Thinking — Cognitive Skills

Developing our cognitive skills by taking different perspectives, evaluating information and making sense of the world as an interconnected whole, is essential for wise decision-making.

Critical Thinking

Skills in critically reviewing the validity of views, evidence and plans.

Complexity Awareness

Understanding of and skills in working with complex and systemic conditions and

Perspective Skills

Skills in seeking, understanding and actively making use of insights from contrasting perspectives.

Sense-making

Skills in seeing patterns, structuring the unknown and being able to consciously create stories.

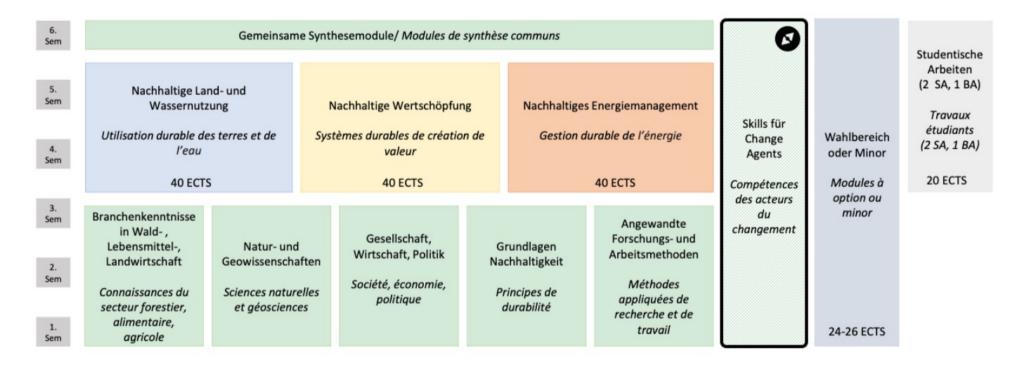
Inner Development for Outer Change

"Inner development is the structured and evolving practice of fostering self-awareness, resilience, and actionable skills to drive sustainable change.

Our minimum standard include:

- 1. **Breadth:** Building habits through regular and integrated practices throughout the educational journey, rather than isolated, one-off sessions.
- 2. **Depth:** Addressing multiple dimensions of growth, focusing on at least five (?) key areas of the 23 Inner Development Goals (IDGs).
- 3. **Purpose:** Cultivating attitudes and actions that directly contribute to sustainability and socio-economic transformation that benefits people & planet.
- 4. **Continuous Evolution:** Embedding a clear learning and feedback process to adapt and improve inner development practices over time."

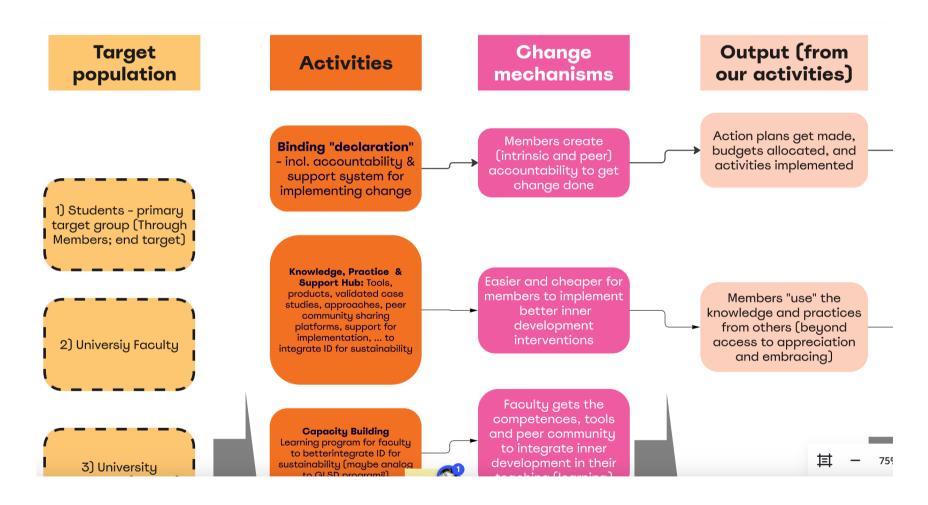

What is in Scope

- Higher Education Focus: The primary focus is on integrating IDGs within higher education institutions.
- Core Focus on Students: Emphasizing student empowerment, sensemaking, and personal development.
- Bridging with Industry: Linking educational efforts with industry transformation and entrepreneurship.
- Institutional Change: Encouraging systemic change from bottom-up to top-down approaches.
- Communication Pathways: Developing effective communication strategies to reach a broader audience.

What is Not in Scope

- Religious Education: The initiative does not aim to cover religious education or promote specific religious frameworks.
- Dogmatic Approaches: Avoiding rigid, prescriptive methods in favor of flexible, open-minded strategies.
- Isolated Inner Growth: The focus is on integrated measures that link inner and outer dimensions of transformation, avoiding isolated efforts that do not contribute to sustainable approaches.
- In conclusion, the discussions have laid a foundation for a transformative approach to
 education that prioritizes inner development and aligns with broader societal goals. The vision
 is ambitious, aiming for a holistic integration of IDGs that prepares students for meaningful
 contributions to society.



Assumptions:

- students need and want inner development support to build the competences & resilience for the outer change they need to face post higher education
- universities are noticing the issues that students are facing and are looking for solutions
 - there are enough pockets of innovation and practicing faculty to start building momentum
- there is a need for increased competences, higher level support, inner and outer pressure and resources for the change to become possible
 - universities have the mandate to contribute to wellbeing and sustainability across society
